



#### History of Peru

- 20,000 BC Humans cross land bridge to Americas.
- 11,000 BC tools found in Peru.
- 6000 3000 BC Communities switch from nomadic to farming using irrigation canals.
- 2000 BC Large observatory/temples.
- 1438 AD Incan Empire unites many cultures/cities. Cusco is capital.
- 1450 Machu Picchu constructed.
- 1525 Smallpox sweeps in to Peru from Panama attacking a population of 10 million.
- 1620 Mainly due to infectious diseases as well as colonization, indigenous population reduced to 1 million.
- 1532 Francisco Pizarro arrives followed by a decade of forced colonization. 13,000 pounds of gold art sent to Spain, to be melted down. Over the next century 360,000 pounds of gold was sent to Spain, supporting that country. (\$6,870,000,000 at today's price of gold.)
- 1811-1824 Wars of independence.
- 1800's Wars of territorial disputes.
- 1930-1979 Alternating between democracy and military juntas.
- 1979–Today Democracy.
- Today Peru has the worlds 39<sup>th</sup> largest economy. Per capita GDP is \$12,000. Average yearly wage is \$6,000. (U.S. is \$40,700)

#### Gustavo Gutierrez – "father of Liberation Theology"

- Born June 8, 1928: A mestizo in the Monserrat barrio of Lima, Peru.
- Spent his teen years in bed and wheelchair with polio.
- Trained for medicine but changed to become a Roman Catholic priest.
- Church recognized his unusual theological talent and sent him for graduate work at Louvain(Belgium), Lyons(France) and the Gregorian (Italy).
- Ordained in 1959.
- Parish Priest in Rimac a slum area in Lima.
- <u>A Theology of Liberation</u> is published in 1971.
- Supports "base communities" small groups within church who combine bible study with involvement for change. Over 100,000 base communities in Latin America 70's and 80's.
- Professor at the Political Catholic University of Peru.
- Legion of Honor from France in 1993
- American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 2003.
- 90<sup>th</sup> birthday. Pope Francis thanks him for his contributions "to the church and humanity through your theological service and your preferential love for the poor and discarded of society".
- Currently holds the John Cardinal O'Hara Professorship of Theology at the University of Notre Dame.

 In the Bible, Christ is presented as the one who brings us liberation. Christ the Savior liberates from sin, which is the ultimate root of all disruption of friendship and of all injustice and oppression. GG

God loves preferentially the poor and oppressed whose situation of premature and unjust death contradicts the divine will of history. GG

Liberation theology seeks to show that unless we make an ongoing commitment to the poor, who are the privileged members of the reign of God, we are far removed from the Christian message. GG

Critical reflection on praxis in light of the word of God is our best safeguard against the gospel being derailed again. And if, nonetheless, that happens, the same process of self-correction will finally prevail once again. RMB

As a persistent theme in the Hebrew Scriptures, and a central concern in Jesus' parables, the kingdom of God presents an alternative picture – God's vision of what the world could be – a world in which justice flourishes, compassion abounds, and concern for the poor is paramount. RMB

But for those who have seen Jesus through the new lens provided by liberation theology, a different picture begins to emerge. Jesus, in sharing our humanity, did not do so as a king, or a royal potentate or as part of the ruling class of society; he did so as one who was born into, and lived among, the poor himself. He identified with the outcast because he was one of them......So radical and unsettling was his message that he lasted not more than 3 years on the public scene...those with power perceived him as such a threat that they did away with him through a phony trial and a judicial murder. RMB

Theology must think critically about its own foundations. GG

The heretofore "absent from history" are making the free gift of the Father's love their own today, creating new social relationships of a community of brothers and sisters. This is the point of departure for what we call "theology from the underside of history". GG
